Washington, Doc. 3 .- The Pre-ident's Message to Congress, to-day, says that the re-sistance to the General Government having exhausted itsel, the first question was, whother the territories within the limits of the States which attempted to secede should be held as conquered territories under military authority emanating from the President; but he considers that the military government established for an intefinite period would have offered no security for the suppression of the discontentment, would have divided the peop e into vanquishers and vanducided the peop e into vanducided the p quished, and envenomed their hatred rather than restored their affection. The true theory is, that all iretended acts of seces-sion were, from the leginning, null and void. States cannot permit treason in the indivi-dual citizen who may have committed treason in the attempt to secode and object their States in a con it ion who a the functions States in a condition who were suspended but a State refuses to permore necessity that the royed; but if flice, there is Government should maintain its , and as soon should maintain its! , and as soon as practicable, resume ne exercise all its functions. On this principle had he acted and gradually and quietly, by almost imperceptible steps sought to resore the righ ful authority of the Government and of the States. To that end, Provisional Governors were appointed. All parties engaged in the late te rible conflict, must work in harmony was not too much to ask: that on the one side the plan of restoration shall proceed in conformity with a willingness to cast the di-cord of the p-st into oblivion, and that on the other hand, the evidence of security the future maintenance of the Union shall be put beyond any doubt by the ratification of the proposed ant slavery amendment to the Constitution. This amendment being adopted, it would remain for the States to adopted, it would remain for the States to resume their places in the two branches of Congless, and thereby complete the work of restoration. The first cut says he has no authority to make freedmen electors; that remains with the States. They can legide whether it is to be adopted a left or introduced gradually with conditions. Good faith, however, requires the security of the freedmen in their liberty and property, the right to labor and reap the first return of their labor. The President says that it will be his constant aim to propose peace and be his constant aim to promote peace and amity with all foreign nations. He thinks all of them are animated by the same dispo-sition. The accordance of belligerent rights to the insurgent States was an unjustifiable act. Great Britain cannot be justified. She built ships, furnished men and material of war to the insurgents. Justification for this cannot be sanctioned before the tribunal of the world. At the same time he does not advise at present, an attempt at redress by acts of legislation. The future friendship between the two countries must rest on a basis of mutual justice. We have wisely forborne as became the propagandists of Republicanism, but it would be a cause of great calamity to them, and breach of good government, should any foreign power chal-lenge the American people to its defense against foreign interference. He relies on the wisdom and justice of those powers to to respect the system of non-interference which has so long been sanctioned by time. New York, Dec. 5.—The report of the Sec-

retary of the Navy suggests a thorough survey of the Islands on the Pacific coast, and the enlargement of the Navy Yard at Mare Island, San Francisco. The number of blockade runners and other ve-sels captured during the war is 265. The Secretary intimates that the expense of the navy to the end of June, 1866, will be nearly \$24,000,-

Washington, Dec. 4.—The following was introduced by Mr. Sumner, in the Senate,

Resolved, That in order to provide proper guarantees for security in future, so that peace and prosperity shall surely prevail, and the plighted faith of the Nation be preserved, it is the duty of Congress to take care that no State declared to be in rebellion, shall be allowed to resume its relation to the Union till after satisfactory performance be given, upon several conditions, which con-ditions by precedent, must be submitted to popular vote, and sanctioned by a majority of the people of each State respectively, as follows: Complete re establishment of loyalty as shown by honest recognition of the union, of the Republic, and the duty of alle-giance to it all times without equivocation of any kind. Complete suppression of all oligarchical pretensions and complete enfranchisement of all citizens, so that here shall be no denial of rights on account of color or race, but justice shall be equal be-fore the law. Rejection of the rebel debt, and at the same time adopt in just proportion the National debt and national obligations to the Union soldiers with solemn pleages never to join in any measure direct or indirect, for their repudiation, or in any way tending to Impair national credit. An organization or

educational system for the equal benefit of all, without distinction of color of race; choice of cit zens for office, whether state or national, of constant and undoubted loyalty; whose conduct and conversation shall give

whose conduct and conversation shart give assurance of peace and reconciliation.

Resolved, That in order to preserve these essential safeguards, without which national security and national faith will be imperiled, States lately in rebellion cannot be precipitated to political independence, but they must wait until these conditions are in all respects fulfilled.
