

THE LEGISLATURE--SPECIAL SESSION.

DEC. 5. THE HOUSE.—In the House the Committee on Credentials asked for time to report the contested election case from the Fifteenth Representative District. A joint resolution was offered authorizing the printing of 500 copies of the Governor's Message and accompanying documents.

THE SENATE.—A Joint Resolution was offered by Mr. Pyle adopting the Amendment to the National Constitution.

DEC. 6.—THE SENATE.—Some unimportant business was done, and the Constitutional Amendment was adopted, by the following vote: Yeas—Messrs. Cornelius, Dohney, Frazier, Greenwood, Grim, Hinsdale, Hovey, Palmer, Pyle, Wagner, Watson and Mr. President—13.

THE HOUSE.—Mr. Hogue was admitted, as member from the Fifteenth District. A resolution authorizing inquiry into the causes of the delay in printing the Compilation of Laws was introduced by Mr. Cartwright. It provides for a joint committee.

KIT CARSON—His PERSONAL APPEARANCE.—Kit Carson and Col. Bent called on Gen. Pope this morning at 10 o'clock, and had a somewhat lengthy interview. From a hurried glance of the famous mountaineer, while waiting a few moments in the anteroom at headquarters, we judged him to be a man below the medium size, rather squat in stature, of compact, iron frame, and a countenance besprinkled with slight wrinkles, betokening an expression of great determination and reserved power.

He appeared reserved, modest, and of a retiring nature, as is often characteristic of men of positive character. His countenance was bronzed from exposure, and a gentleman who met him said, "There goes an Indian." Kit was dressed in a Colonel's uniform, with rather broad shoulder-straps, and his dark hair, slightly sprinkled with gray, flowed down upon his shoulders a la waterfall. He wore a rather broad, brimmed felt, and altogether presented the appearance of a sturdy little man, destitute of all pretensions. Word soon came from Gen. Pope to admit the two gentlemen into his private room, and Kit took off his felt hat and gently bowed himself into the presence of the Commanding General. Col. Carson served as a Brigadier under Gen. Crocker, in New Mexico.—St. Louis News, October 27.
