Anagat you Robsbay－Pingonea Conygsess A man named Trickle was arreated by Mar，hal Koeler yeaterday moraing about 40 o＇elock，as he was about to go aboard of the downward bound steamer．He had been suspected of the robbery of a miner named Alby on the rond from the Granite Creek mines down to Umatilla，ten dayg aince．Triokle and Alby were traveling companions from the mines， and the money which Trickie stole，was placed，at one of the stations on the road，on－ der the side of a haystack．When Alby went to find it，it was gone．Suspicion at flrst fell on another person，but at length was diverted to Trickle，who came down from Umatilla two or three daye ago．The amount was $\$ 1045$ ，and Alby was so discouraged by his loss that he returned to the mines．Trickle was＂shadowed＂until the time of bis ar－

For nome weeks past wo have been collect mines discovered on the western tributarien of the Colombia River，between $51^{\circ}$ and $52^{\circ}$ $30^{\prime}$ north．We are at lest in a position to lay before our readera some definite information in relation to the location，extent，character and richness of these mines．
The peculiar physicat teatures of the coun－ Pry out of which flow the castern waters of Fraser and the western affluents of the Co － lumbis，render an uoderstanding of the lo－ cation of the mines an easy task．The flow－ age of those two great etresims is divided by a range of mountains running north and south，called Selkirk Range，an 1 the Colum－ bia comes down from the porth on the east side of this ridge，draining its eastern alope， ad the western slope of the great Roçk Hange．Heading in the western slope of the cikirk Range，are the waters of Thompson＇
Biver，tributary of Frazer．Among the argeat streams running off to Thompson＇s is Souswap River，and on ite heads bome fine prospects have been obtained．But our sub－ ject is those gold deposits swept from the
enatern slope of Selkirk Range by creeks emp－ ying into the Columbia．
The first of these comes in two hundred and fifty miles above Colville，and is called Oarnes＇Oreek；the dext is French Oreek which comes in forty miles further up，st the Dalles de mort．A few miles further up is Gold Creek，which has for its tributary，Mc－ alloch＇s Oreek．
ong the Columbia trom Coiville，it widens ou at two points into great lakes，called the Lower and Upper Arrow Lake．Juat above the head of Opper Arrow，but some miles be low the head of narigation，is the mouth of Carnes Crenk，and the other streams come in in the order，and at the distanses stated
