DATES TO DECEMBER 5.

Washington, Nov. 17.—To B. F. Perry, Provisional Governor of South Carolina: I do not think it necessary for members elected from South Carolina, to be present at the organization of Congress. On the contrary, it will be better policy to present their certificates of election after the two houses have organized, which will then be the simple question under the Constitution of members taking their seats. Each house must judge for itself as to election returns, and qualifications of its own members. As to what the two houses will do in reference to the oath required to be taken before the members can take their seats it is unknown to me, and I do not like to predict, at upon the whole, I am of opinion that it would be better for the question to come up and be disposed of after the two houses have been organized. I hope your Legislature will adopt a code in reference to free persons of color, that will be acceptable to the country, and at the same time doing justice to the white and colored populations.

It is rumored that the President will withdraw the Provisional Governors as soon as the several States shall ratify the amendment to the National Constitution, admit and give freedom the right to testify in the courts, and repudiate the rebel debt; also that military forces will be withdrawn and the Freedman's Bureau discontinued as soon as a disposition is shown to give freedmen a fair trial. He will then consider the work of reconstruction complete, and recognize them as States upon an equal footing with the Northern States, and the war would be at an end.

One hundred and fifty pardons, all of the \$20,000 clause, were duly signed and issued by the President yesterday. A large number now excluded in the Amnesty Proclamation will be pardoned by another proclamation. Among the captured rebel property in North Carolina, was a lot of paper money, bearing the imprint of the National Bank Note Company. The engraving was well executed and the bills were printed in Green Ink, supposed to have been done by Northern artists. The company has been called on for an explanation by the Secretary of the Treasury.

Congressional.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.

Senate.—Watts presented a bill to regulate the elective franchise in the District of Columbia. The bill provides that from and after its passage, every male citizen, twenty-one years of age, who is a citizen of the United States, and resident in the District for six months, and never been convicted of any infamous crime, shall have the right of suffrage in said District. Section second imposes a penalty for interruption or interference with rights granted by the above bill. Ordered to be printed.

Sumner introduced a bill to preserve the right of trial by jury, which provides that grand juries shall consist one-half of persons of African descent in sections where one-sixth of the population are Africans, and the same proportion in petit juries where the matter relates to any injuries inflicted by persons of African descent. Upon persons not of such descent, or vice versa, prejudice against such African race is made the ground of challenge and exclusion from such juries; ordered printed.

Sumner introduced a bill prescribing an oath to maintain a Republican form of government, in States in rebellion, as follows: "I do hereby swear that I will, at all times hereafter, use my best endeavors to maintain a Republican form of government in the State of which I am an inhabitant, and the Union of the United States; that I will at all times recognize indissoluble loyalty to the Republic; I will always discountenance any endeavors to break away or secede from the Union; will give my influence and vote at all times to sustain the national credit; will always discountenance and resist any attempt, directly or indirectly, to postpone, either in any part the debt contracted by the United States in the rebellion, or obligations assumed to Union soldiers; will always discountenance and resist any laws making any distinction of race or color, and always strive to maintain a State Government completely loyal to the Union, where all men shall enjoy equal protection and rights."

Such oath shall be preserved; if falsely taken such person shall be guilty of perjury, and in addition to the present penalty for that crime, he shall forfeit his right to hold office. Ordered printed.

Sumner offered a bill to enforce the constitutional amendment by punishing any attempt to control the services of any persons contrary to this provision by a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars or imprisonment not exceeding ten years, or both, at the discretion of the court. It shall be no defense that claim is sanctioned by State law. It annuls the State law in conflict with it. Also regarding cases going out of the United States Court. Ordered printed.

Sumner introduced a joint resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution, so as to make voters, instead of population, the basis of representation in Congress.
