

CIRCUIT COURT PROCEEDINGS.

At the opening of Court on Monday, the prompt and punctual attendance of jurors was the subject of general remark. Of those summoned but one failed to respond, and he, being in the employ of the United States Government, could properly claim his excuse. In addition to the attorneys residing at the Dalles, Messrs. Strong, Johnson and Moreland, of Portland were in attendance. A number of indictments that have stood upon the docket from one to four years, were dismissed, for the reasons that defendants had absconded, or died, or that the witnesses could not be procured to prove the different offences charged. The docket on the opening of the court showed 41 criminal, 34 law and 10 equity causes.

LAW CAUSES.—Fulton vs Logan, continued; Brown et al vs McAuliff, dismissed as settled; Weir vs Caris, demurrer to complaint overruled—on calling for trial a non-suit was granted to plaintiff; Bloch & Co. vs Evans et al, dismissed as settled; Violet vs Smith, judgment by default for plaintiff for \$835 40; Robbins & Co. vs Moppin et al, judgment by default for plaintiffs for \$776; Nesple vs Henderson, continued for service; O. S. N. Company vs R. H. Wood, Administrator of the estate of Laughlin, decree for conveyance of lands in Dalles City; Waldron vs Newell—settled—dismissed; Dusenberry Bro. vs Harris & Findlander, continued; T. B. Ke'ly vs E. P. & M. Fitzgerald—action for damages for battery. Trial lasted two days—Kelly & Gates for plaintiff, Strong, Humason & Odell for defendants—verdict for plaintiff for \$475; Broback vs Farman, et al, continued for service; Robbins & Co. vs Shank et al, dismissed without prejudice, at plaintiffs costs; Robbins & Co. vs A. & W. H. Lands, judgment by default for plaintiffs for \$651 89; C. Lee vs Chapman & Simms—settled—dismissed; Geo. L. Woods vs Tolliver Johnson et al—trial by jury—verdict for plaintiff, \$400.

Mr. Condon's Lecture.—Mr. Condon deserves the praise of being the first who has devoted much time and attention to the collection of the fossils of the Columbia Basin. About four years ago a gentleman was engaged by the Smithsonian Institute to give this interior a cursory examination, with a view to a more exact geological survey. The agent employed lacked both the industry and the conscientious regard for duty, necessary to render his mission in anywise successful. Mr. Condon's investigations are necessarily limited, and are mostly confined to the collection of remains which have written the history of the past on the rocks in characters which are not open to contradiction. Geology may properly be called the record of Nature's works, written by herself. The lecture was illustrated by the already very extensive collection of Mr. Condon, which includes many fragmentary specimens of now extinct animals—from the mighty mammoth to the smaller quadrupeds. These indicate with absolute certainty the natural history of this country, during that period just following the time when "the earth was without form and void, and darkness was on the face of the deep."—There were rhinoceroses, in those days, whose bones lie buried along the beaches of lakes which ran dry ages ago; the mastodon fed upon the trees which grew during his period, and the fossils tell us that in the tertiary period they did not essentially differ from the trees of the present day. As the mammoth lived later than that time we conclude that his diet was of alder, birch, cottonwood and willow. In the line of stratification, in one case, is a specimen of fruit, not unlike a plum, but with a rougher rind than modern plums. But there are none of these now. There were cherry-trees in those days, and that reasonably indicates that there were birds to eat cherries; hence the big quadrupeds in all probability heard the songs of the very warblers which we hear in these later times. Mr. Condon exhibited specimens of rocks with shells of various kinds imprinted in them, and geodes, where the waters had been ages in first liquefying and then crystallizing ordinary quartz, until it was almost as brilliant as diamond. There were bones mineralized and petrified, and the cavities which once held their marrows filled with chalcidony. As we expect to publish at considerable length these lessons of the rocks, we forbear further mention of the subject matter of the discourse, with the addition that it was well attended by an intelligent and appreciative audience.
