FRENCH OPINION OF PRESIDENT JOHNSON.—The Paris *Constitutionnel* writes in favor of President Johnson's policy of conciliation. Noticing his speech to the southern delegates, it says:

After a discourse as conciliatory as pacific, the hour of unreserved clemency has arrived, and under penalty of a regrettable contradiction, the sympathetic words of the President cannot fail to translate themselves in acts. This will be, without doubt, a most happy surprise; but America is an astonishing nation, where the most profound transformations take place as if by enchantment. In a single day this eminently practical people is stricken with madness and precipitates itself into all the horrors of a civil war; the strife ceases, and instead of all the excesses of a reaction it disbands its armies, re-assumes again its peaceful occupations, and begins talking all of a sudden the language of reasonable people. Its statesmen check themselves in their road to useless vengeance, and know how to employ, in their self-sacrifice, the generous words, which, far better than mere force, disarm their enemies and appease their hatred.

A GREAT MAN.—The *State Journal* thus describes one of the movers in the repeal of the Specific Contract Law in this State:

It is now quite certain that Oregon has at least one remarkable man. His talent is represented as being of a very high order, so high that it is above the comprehension of other men, and his honesty is so pure and transparent that it can't be seen with the naked eye. As an officer of the Agricultural Society, he distinguished himself. As a member of the Legislature, he became the author of "many bills," and introduced all his private writings and compositions into laws, and had them printed at the expense of the State. It is rumored that his very large and queer *tum tum*, combined with an expanding, gumolastic sort of conscience would not allow him to vote for a law which he was afraid would "damage the national finances," but did not prevent him from "damaging the finances" of his neighbors, by defrauding them out of about one half the amount he owed them.

BEATEN AT HIS OWN GAME.—A story is told of a man who insured in London 1,000 cigars, valued at \$200, against fire and water. After the lapse of six months he made his appearance at the insurance office and demanded his money as the cigars had all been burned. "But not on board the vessel sir," said the secretary, "for she is in dock now." "Yes, on board the vessel; I smoked them, and therefore burned them myself, and the insurance says against fire." The secretary seemed taken aback, but told the smoker to call again next day. He called at the appointed time, but was met by the solicitor of the company, who told him if he did not relinquish his claim he would be prosecuted as one who knowingly and willingly set fire to goods insured by the company.

The commissioners appointed by the President to examine that portion of the Union Pacific railroad, running from Kansas City to Lawrence, in Kansas, about 50 miles, and just finished, have met there, but cannot agree as to its condition, and the duty of accepting it on the part of the government. The majority are against its acceptance. Trains are now running regularly over the road, however.

The new telegraph line across the continent is rapidly going ahead. It is to be called the United States Pacific telegraph; James Street is president, and James Gamble is general superintendent in California; and they are making contracts for wire and poles, and for much of the distance from San Francisco this way will be put up this fall.
