

THE ROLL OF REPRESENTATIVES.—The question has been raised whether the Clerk of the last House of Representatives from the reorganized states upon the roll of the next Congress. The law leaves him no discretion in the matter. The act of March 3, 1863, provides that "before the first meeting of the next Congress, and of every subsequent Congress, the clerk of the next preceding House of Representatives shall make a roll of the representatives elect, and place thereon the names of all persons, and of such persons only, whose credentials show that they were regularly elected in accordance with the laws of their states respectively, or the laws of the United States." The representatives elect from Virginia and the other southern states will bring such credentials, and the clerk can refuse to enroll their names only on the assumption that the states from which they come are not in the Union. As Congress and the executive have consistently maintained that they are in the Union, and acted accordingly, the clerk is not likely to make the contrary assumption. It becomes an interesting question, therefore, how to prevent the southern members from voting for speaker. At the first session of the last Congress the name of the Louisiana members were placed on the roll by the clerk, and Mr. Stevens of Pennsylvania vainly attempted to get the names erased before the election of speaker. It was settled by the action of Congress in that case that the clerk must enroll the names of all members having apparently authentic credentials, and that the question of the right of any member to his seat cannot be raised until after the House is organized.—Springfield Republican.

GOVERNOR HUMPHREYS' INAUGURAL ADDRESS.—Governor Humphreys, of Mississippi, in his inaugural address, says: "I have always believed that no one or more States could constitutionally sever ties that unite people of the several States in one. The people rejected this school of politics. Those advocating the right of secession could not have found a better mode of solving the question than the arbitrament of war. The question was forthwith referred, and decided against us. The people of Mississippi acknowledge the decision, and express their wish to return to the Union. It has been officially reported that our people are not sincere, but if unflinching fidelity in war gives evidence of reliable fidelity in peace, the unvarying professions that spring from private and public sources furnish evidence of its truth. It is demonstrated that the people of the South may be safely trusted, when they profess more than willingness to return to their allegiance. The State of Mississippi has already, by her own solemn act, abolished slavery, and it is due to her honor to show by her future that she has done so in good faith, and that slavery shall never again flourish in our border in whatsoever name or guise it may be brought forward."

CONFISCATION COMPLAINTS.—The most unreasonable of the complaints against President Johnson, says the Springfield Republican, is, that he has interfered with the confiscation of rebel property. In the first place, it is not true that he has stopped any legal process of confiscation. He has merely restored property seized and occupied for military purposes. There is no law of war, and no other law, by which such property can now be held; and the General Government cannot be expected to go into robbery as a regular business. There is a Confiscation Law in existence, and some rebel property has been attached under it. This law can be enforced upon the property of unpardoned rebels, if the Government thinks it worth while. But it is not. It will not pay expenses. The Government

can give no valid title to such property beyond the life of the present owners; and nobody will pay a price for property that may pass out of their hands the next month. There is no doubt how the Supreme Court will decide such cases, for the Constitution still exists in that Court. Confiscation is therefore out of the question.
