CIRCUIT COURT PROCEEDINGS.

Most of the time of the Court on Thursday and Friday was occupied in the trial of two causes, and in the submission of several de-Wa-co county vs Cohn et al, formurrers. Wa-co county vs Cohn et al, for-feiture of bond for the appearance of Roth-kopp, charged with larceny; judgment for plaintiff—paid \$30—balance due. Brown & Co, vs Marshall—judgment on demurrer to answer for plaint ff-in \$1,230; the judgment can be satisfied by paying half the amount in gold and silver coin. Smith vs Graham et al—trial for damages for taking personal property, and injury to other property; verproperty, and injury to other property; ver-dict for \$100 for p'aintiff, for injury. Heller vs Blakeny-malicious prosecution; trial lasted all day Friday, and at the close of court the jury had not returned a verdict.

LIABLE TO INDICTMENT .- A correspondent of the Oregonian, writing from La Grande, gets off the following:

At the November term of the Circuit Court just passed, a number of our merchants and business men were arraigned and fined for the violation of the ' Sunday Law;" and the opposition party are doing all they can to make capital out of the affair against the Union cause; but the man who will allow local prejudices to make inroads on his loyalty, deserves not the name of Republican or Democrat, according to the literal significa-tion of those terms.
