## CIRCUIT COURT PROCEEDINGS.

Most of the time of the Court on Thursday and Friday was occupied in the trial of two causes, and in the submission of several demurrers. Wa-co county vs Cohn et al, forfeiture of bond for the appearance of Rothkoop, charged with larceny; judgment for plaintiff—paid \$30—balance due. Brown & Co. vs Marshall—judgment on demurrer to answer for plaintiff in \$1,230; the judgment can be satisfied by paying half the amount in gold and silver coin. Smith vs Graham et al—trial for damages for taking personal property, and injury to other property; verdict for \$100 for plaintiff, for injury. Heller vs Blakeny—malicious prosecution; trial lasted all day Friday, and at the close of court the jury had not returned a verdict.

**LIABLE TO INDICTMENT.**—A correspondent of the *Oregonian*, writing from La Grande, gets off the following:

At the November term of the Circuit Court just passed, a number of our merchants and business men were arraigned and fined for the violation of the 'Sunday Law'; and the opposition party are doing all they can to make capital out of the affair against the Union cause; but the man who will allow local prejudices to make inroads on his loyalty, deserves not the name of Republican or Democrat, according to the literal significance of those terms. The institution of the Sunday Law was secured by ecclesiastical, instead of political, influence; and as a necessity, we must submit to this dispensation until revoked by the voice of the majority. For my part, I feel that I've but little ground of complaint, as the penalty attached to this sacred law, is only a "small fry" affair when compared to the "stoning" process in vogue during the ecclesiastical rule of past ages. Mr. Editor, I hope you will excuse me for boldly and freely expressing my views. I've been inclined to piety from my childhood, and have ever cherished the highest regard for the Sabbath. So profound has been my reverence, that even the song of the birds has fallen inharmonious on my ears when warbled forth on the Sabbath day—would have gagged them, and hushed their sacrilegious notes; but they wisely refused to be "arrested." And there is the irreverent bee, desecrating God's appointed day, by gathering honey from early dawn till twilight eve. In contemplating these aggravating and profane features of animated nature, I've grown sick with disgust, and sought relief in the contemplation of things celestial; but even then, I failed to find consolation, for humming and whirling and surging around their central suns, flow ten thousand worlds, never halting a moment; but ever onward—"every day and Sunday too."

**SKATING.**—The masculine juvenile elements of society, and many children of a larger growth, have seized with avidity the occasion of the freeze-up to bring out their skates and go a skating. The amusement is somewhat limited on account of the lack of room on the skating grounds. To many it is hardly amusement at all, particularly those who are but beginners, judging from the frequent fractures—caused by the impact of heads and other parts of the body with the ice. However, those who intend to skate had better make the most of the ice while it lasts, as a "Chinook" is liable to come at any moment.

**HORACE GREENE** favors the idea of allowing Congressional districts to elect non-residents. The notion of being elected by a constituency in which a candidate does not reside, is very popular with a class of men who cannot be elected in that in which they do reside.

It is thought that an effort will be made by some of the members of the Washington Territory Legislature to have the word "white" stricken out of the laws defining the qualifications of electors in that Territory, at its present session.
