THE CHIEF OF THE FENIANS, AND THEIR OBJECTS.—The New York correspondent of the London Times writes thus to his journal: The head of the Order here is a wild looking young man named O'Mahoney. He has an office, "headquarters," it is styled, in Duane street, No. 22. I called there a few days ago, and saw him. He was scudily dressed, and had that familiar, slovenly, lounging air that distinguishes those hangers-on of small politicians and petty Courts, here, who are known by the familiar name of "bummers." He told me that the Order numbered over two hundred thousand persons; that they had money and arms; that no religious test was required of the members; that their object was to liberate Ireland; that their great cause of discontent was the laws of entail and primogeniture, which prevented the poorer classes in Ireland from becoming owners of the soil; that the United States Government know what they are about, and would not interfere with them; that the organization had been in existence for several years, but that nothing practical had been done until the late war had inured their men to arms. This was about all I could get out of him. When I inteposed objections to the scheme, he smiled, and said that they had thought of everything. They would first take Canada, and by that means obtain shipping, etc. All this appeared to me to be mere nonsense, and with that impression I left him. But I ascertained from the neighbors that wagon loads of muskets are driven up to his door every day, sent up stairs to be inspected, and then driven away again. Expressmen with remittances of money are constantly in attendance on him. Two of them came in while I was talking to him. One package contained twenty-four, and the other, three dollars. These facts prove to me that, however wild the scheme is, it has plenty of adherents, and faithful ones, too. My correspondent in Washington informs me that O'Mahoney's statement concerning the indifference of the Government is true; that a leading officer of the Treasury informed him that the subject had been canvassed in high official quarters; that it had been observed that the agitation would produce a flow of capital from England to this country—a thing very much to be desired, and that when England noticed the occurrence of this inevitable phenomenon, she would let Canada go rather than prolong the agitation.
