 To the Honorable J. G. Wilson, Judge of Circuit Court—We, the Grand Jury of Wasco County, respectfully report that we have inspected the buildings used for County purposes. We find the hospital small but comfortable, and inmates well cared for. The building used for Court House and Jail, we find a poor substitute, and recommend the erection of a more suitable building. The broken stove now used to warm the cells of the Jail, we believe unsafe, and should be replaced by a better one. The comfort of the prisoners we think is provided for as well as the arrangements of the building will admit of.

 The American Express Company of New York, in 1864, paid cash dividends to the amount of thirty-eight per cent. on a capital of \$2,000,000, in addition to fifty per cent. in paid-up stock on an increase of its capital to \$3,000,000, equal to eighty eight per cent. for one year's profits on a capital that did not originally cost one-half of its then fixed value. On its increased capital of \$3,000,000, the same company paid, during the first eight months of the present year, twenty-six per cent. in cash, and twenty-five per cent. in additional paid-up stock, and a further cash dividend of twenty five per cent. is expected for the balance, (four months) of the year—over one hundred per cent. per annum on its actual paid up capital. The stock of this company, at last reports from New York, was selling at three times its par value. What wonder, then, that the railroads, out of whose legitimate business this profit is chiefly made, are taking steps to put an end to such a useless drain upon their business and the pockets of the people.
