## Epitome of Telegraphic News.

[COMPILED FROM THE OREGONIAN.]

### DATES TO DECEMBER 12.

New York, Dec. 11—Among the evidences Virginia has given of reconstructed loyalty, is that of Capt. William Steeples, Internal Revenue Tax Collector, who has been indicted by the Grand Jury of Prince William county, for seizing property under cover of Federal cavalry, to pay the United States. The guerilla Moseby is employed to prosecute the case.

The Herald's Richmond correspondent says that the military police will be withdrawn from that city on the 15th, and civil police substituted.

The members of the Virginia Legislature seem to have decided that devotion to the rebel cause during the war, is to be the measure of merit, and have therefore determined to remove all Unionists holding State offices, and to put secessionists in their places. They have also adopted an amendment to the State Constitution, which does away with all disabilities for holding office on account of participation in the late rebellion. It does not even require an oath of allegiance to the national Government.

General Hooker, who has been alarmingly ill for the past ten days is now slowly recovering.

In the church of the Holy Trinity, Brooklyn, last evening, Bishop Clay of Arkansas, and Bishop Potter of New York, made able addresses in behalf of the Protestant Episcopal Freedmen's Aid Society.

The ladies engaged in the Treasury department at Washington, are preparing a petition to Congress to have their salaries increased.

The immigration to New York from Europe from the 1st of January to the 31st of Oct., 1865, footed up 163,009.

A dispatch from Washington says: General Logan's instructions as Minister to Mexico, are being prepared. He will accompany President Juarez wherever he goes.

The State Department is in receipt of important dispatches from Minister Adams.

Commodore Tatnall and General McLaws formerly of the rebel service, are living in Savannah, in destitute circumstances.

J. E. Murdock has so far recovered from his late illness as to be able to fulfill his engagements in the North.

Acting Rear Admiral J. S. Palmer, the new commander of the West India Squadron, reported for duty at the Brooklyn Navy Yard on Saturday. Admiral Palmer has designated the gunboat Rhode Island, Commander Murray, now at the Navy Yard, as his flag ship, and will sail in her for the new district of operations in a few days.

Commander Corbit has been detailed as Captain of Admiral Palmer's Squadron and is chief of staff to this officer. Paymaster James H. Carpenter has reported a fleet paymaster of the West India Squadron.

### San Francisco News.

San Francisco, Dec. 12.—Barney Olwell is on trial for murder committed in January last. The plea of insanity will be set up in his defense.

John Campbell, indicted for the murder of Anthony dardgrave, will be tried to-morrow.

Since the organization of the Health Department, Nov. 8th, the police has served 480 notices and subpoenas for abating nuisances in different parts of the city.

Judge Wells to-day sentenced William Graves to pay a fine of \$100 or be imprisoned three days in the county jail, for exhibiting a deadly weapon.

Samuel Crain was awarded a Government contract for furnishing one hundred and fifty mules at \$157 40.

The steamer Del Norte, Capt. Fauntleroy, two days from Crescent City, arrived here this morning. She brings \$41,284 in treasure.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COMMON COUNCIL.—The Common Council of Dalles City, met Saturday evening, Dec. 16th, 1865. Present N. H. Gates, Mayor; James M. Bird, E. R. Welch, and W. P. Miller, Councilmen; and F. S. Bolland, Recorder.

The proceedings of the last meeting were read and approved, and signed by the Mayor. Also the warrants drawn on the City Treasurer as per order of the chairman of the committee on streets and public property, for the sum of \$1,150, for balance due Messrs. Adams and Harris on street contract, was approved by the Council.

M. M. Cushing and N. R. Packard were appointed as policemen and night watch.

On motion, the City Marshal was instructed to remove any obstructions on Second street, from Union to Liberty streets.

The application of Wm. Shepard to be appointed on the police was read, and on motion, laid on the table.

The report of F. S. Holland, Recorder, showing the number of cases docketed for the month of November, 1865, and the disposition of each case, wherein Dalles City is plain iff, also the Treasurer's receipt annexed, showing the amount of fines collected and paid over for said month, as follows: In legal tenders, \$60; in coin, \$7; total, \$67.

The said report was read and accepted, and on motion, ordered to be placed on file.
