THE TRIAL OF JEFF. DAVIS.

The N. Y. Herald, of Nov. 1st, on information received from Washington, says that Jeff. Davis is to be arraigned on the charge of treason in levying war against the United States, and the plan of prosecution will embrace no other charge. All charges of complicity with Wirtz, etc., are to be abandoned, and the purpose of the prosecution will be to define the nature of treason and fix its punishment. As the Wirtz trial was intended to reveal the inhumanities of the rebel leaders and forever disgrace the rebel Confederacy in the eyes of the world, the trial of Davis is intended to make equally odious the treason which had bred such horrors. It is well known that Mr. Davis claims that he cannot be tried for treason, on the ground that his State had seceded, and he was bound to follow her lead. His entire defence would rest on the basis of the right of Secession. Such a plea would have but little force, in view of the fact that the late Constitutional Convention of Mississippi, the State which Davis represents, nullified instead of repealing the Act of Secession, thus declaring that the State did not secede, and agreeing with one of the great principles which President Johnson adopted and persistently maintained, that none of the Southern States were ever legally out of the Union. It was also determined that the Wirtz trial should be the last trial by Court Martial. The trial of Davis will be before the highest tribunal in the land. It is not known as yet whether Chief Justice Chase will preside, but it is presumed that he will. At a Cabinet session in August, when the details were arranged, it was decided that the trial of Davis should immediately follow that of Wirtz, but the long delays in that case may tend to delay that of Davis. The Attorney-General was authorized to select three counsel to aid him in the prosecution. Mr. Speed is a native of the South, and it was decided that another Southern and two Northern lawyers should be retained. It was suggested that it was desirable that the army should also be represented. The following attorneys were finally selected as the prosecuting counsel: Hon. James Speed, Attorney General of the United States, Hon. John H. Clifford, formerly attorney General of Massachusetts, Major General Lowell H. Rousseau, member of Congress elect from Kentucky; Wm. H. Everts, of New York City. It has been understood for several months past that Mr. Davis had selected his counsel, or had accepted the services of the following gentlemen: Charles O'Connor, of New York City; Ransom H. Gillett, of Albany. It is probable that the prisoner will himself supervise, if he does not conduct his defense.

At Marseilles, France, a singular incident has accompanied the development of cholera. The rat-catchers, who hitherto earned a fair livelihood by a per centage on the tails of such as they could exhibit to the police, find their occupation gone with the rats, which have altogether disappeared from the shores and kennels, and betaken themselves to country life.
