THE CITY TRADE.

DALLES CITY, Dec. 21st, 1865.

Of course the freeze up has put an end to the legitimate commercial transactions, by which the inhabitants of this city make money out of other people; but for fear we may loose practice in the arts and tricks of trade, thus incapacitating ourselves from "playing" the outsiders and Philistines when the spring-trad recommences, we have been amusing ourselves on coal-oil. We wish it pretty distinctly understood that this does not apply to any man or set of men, but pretty much the whole community. During the week, coal-oil has "fluctuated." At the first sign of a Chinook wind it would fall to \$2 and 2.50, and as the snow would begin to fall, or the wind shift around to the east, it would raise to \$3.50 and \$4. Everybody was bent on making money out of coal-oil, or what was to the same purpose, trying to make "a corner" of some other article of necessity.

The ultimate effect of such transactions is to induce provident persons to send off for supplies of certain articles, and thus take away the sale of local supplies from those dealers who sacrifice future prospects for present gain. We close our remarks on this point by a sententious and, in this case, peculiarly significant contrast once made between the Mexicans and the Greeks: "The Mexicans are much addicted to robbing—they rob each other—no good can come of such a people; the Greeks are robbers and pirates—they rob other people—a sure sign that they will become a great nation."
