ORIGIN OF POLITICAL TERMS.—The terms "Whig" and "Tory" were known in the reign of Charles II. Some writers derive the word "Whig" from "Whaig," the Scotch for "whey" a name applied to bandits and drovers, and "Tory" from "foory" (Irish) applied to beggars and outlaws. Others say that "Whig" is formed from the motto of the Puritans, "We hope in God," and "Tory" from a "Tar-a-r-i," pronounced "Tory," meaning "Come, O King"—an exclamation much used by the Irish adherents of Charles II. The word "Radical" arose about the year 1818, and "Conservative" about the year 1860.
