THE MONTANA TRADE.

We have advices from Montana to the 25th of November. The Post's commercial artice notes a considerable advance in most of the staples of subsistence, and the article of tobacco bas gone up to an extraordinary figure, with a prospect of being worth \$16 and \$18 a pound before the winter is over. These extraordinary fluctuations indicate the difficulties attending the supply of that country from the east. No degree of foresight can so proportion an assortment as to avoid a scarcity of some necessary article of trade; and the length of time required to communicate with the States exposes the consumer to the fangs of monopolists, who prey upon his necessities. Developments of this character render the acquisition of the Montana trade a possibility to merchants from this side, and all that is needed to render it a certainty, is concert of action and the improvement of means of com-
