THE CITY TRADE.

TUE DALLAS, Oregon, Dec. 21st, 1865.
The supply of flour and staple articles of subsistence in the city is deemed sufficient to meet the local wants, and the entire absence of any outside demand keeps prices at living figures for consumers.

Coal oil has been sold at retail the past week at \$2 50, and a lot of several hundred gallons which was packed from the Cascade, was jobbed out at \$2. The following are our quotations to date:
