

GRAND UNITED GOLD AND DIAMOND DUST COMPANY.—The eagerly expected prospectus has at last appeared of the "Grand United Gold and Diamond Dust Company." The act is already in existence—the insolvent act—to limit the liability of the shareholders.

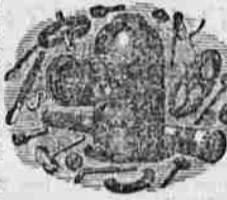

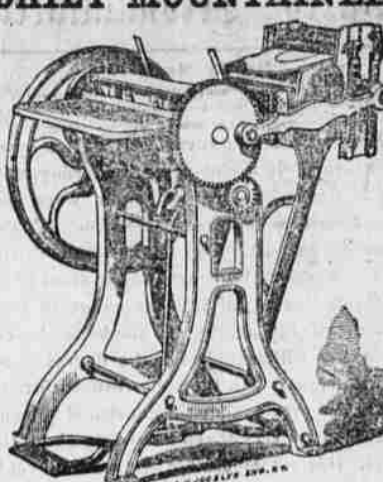
