REPORT OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL.—For the first time in its history the Postoffice Department is self sustaining. It no longer shows the old deficit of five or six millions of dollars on the treasury book. The contracts for the Southern mail service which have been let are at such greatly reduced rates as to lead to the hope that when the mail service is fully reestablished throughout the South, the department will still continue to be seif-sustained. The overland mail service shows greater expenditure for less revenue then any other mail route. The postal money order system has been fairly tried and works with great success, though the government has in its possession considerable amounts of unclaimed moneys. The Postmaster General recommends that the advertising of the letters be left to the postmaster of each city, who in his discretion may select any journal instead of giving it to the one having the largest circulation. Owing to the small prices paid for advertising the letter list, several largely circulated journals have refused to print it, though specially authorized to do so by the law. The result has been something of a loss to the government.

A Fenocious Dog.-The Virginia

City Enterprise says:

Yesterday, (December 5th) an Indian woman came near being killed by a savage bull-dog owned by a man named Allenback. The dog had the poor woman down in the street and was tearing her flesh in the most ferocious manner-a wolf could not have acted more savagely. The scalp on the right side of her head was almost torn off, and her arms and legs were dreadfully torn and mangled. When found the dog was still tearing at the woman, who was so badly injured that she was unable to arise from the ground. But for the timely arrival of assistance the woman would surely have been killed. In at-Allenback had one of her arms badly torn-so we are told. Alderman Piper and one or two others who happened along about the time of the occurrence, took the poor bleeding woman into a vacant room in a house near by, and Dr. C. Derch, whose office is in the Maldanado House, North B street, was sent for.

LOTTERIES VINDICATED BY SCRIP. TURE. 
