THE POISONED CHalice.—At the time of the discovery of the mines in the Nez Perce country, among the first who flocked to our interior was a considerable number of escaped convicts from the California penitentiary. Every year since there have been accessions to the number of these men, until the past season, when this section was made too hot to hold the more conspicuous of these miscreants. From circumstances connected with this class of men, the people of this country have been forced to conclude that the California State authorities would do nothing towards reclaiming these criminals, even when their whereabouts was known. Since they have been treated so roughly up the Columbia and in Montana, they appear to have drifted off into Nevada and California in large numbers, to inaugurate a new epoch of crime in those communities. So that, at last, the sins of the California authorities are coming home to roost, as is evidenced by the frequency of robbery and murder in that State at the present time. The State of Oregon has also been as bad as California, in this respect, and it is notorious that escaped convicts from the Portland penitentiary have publicly run at large in the eastern section of the State, without the State making any attempt to reclaim them. Such a course of conduct is offering a premium for crime, and the reaction will sooner or later come, as in the case of California. The authorities of Idaho and Washington territories have committed similar errors in not reclaiming fugitives from punishment.

MOUNT BLANC was first ascended in 1786; and since then there have been two hundred and ninety-three ascents, of which thirty-five were made in 1865. During the past year Lord Douglas made the most daring descent of that mountain which is on record. He descended with the usual formality of walking down, by tumbling eight thousand feet over the glaciers. His remains were not found for several weeks after the descent.

A LEADING coal-dealer in Philadelphia returns an income of four hundred thousand dollars. How greatly the coal capitalists have suffered by the high price of that article may be judged from this return. We'd like to be made martyrs to the same amount.

The Lebanon (Tenn.) *Herald* estimates the losses of Wilson county, Tennessee, during the war, in slaves, horses, cattle and other stock, houses, fences, crops, etc., at \$7,800,000. Some idea of the poverty of the people may be gathered from these figures.

TEA is being cultivated with success in Georgia. The yield is from three to four hundred pounds to the acre. It is very likely that it can be produced to a great profit in the Willamette Valley. It ought to be tried, anyhow.
