NEWS OF THE INTERIOR IN DETAIL.

The machinery for the hull of the steamer on the Pen d'Oreille Lake has arrived safely at its destination. The hull of the steamer is, by this time, ready to receive it, and by the first of March the steamer will be afloat and ready to take on freight and passengers.

The steamer Forty-Nine, under the command of Capt. L. White, has proven a complete success. On her trial trip, in December, she succeeded in ascending the Columbia one hundred and sixty miles, when fields of floating ice drove her back from some where near the head of Lower Arrow Lake.

John C. McClellan, a settler on the Payette River, perished, it is supposed, in the great storm, on the 13th of December. At that date he started out of Boise Basin, and since then has not been heard of.

Seventeen men, it appears, of Capt. Borland's command, were frozen, on the march from Snake to Powder River, in December. Several amputations of a serious nature will have to be performed. The company is occupying some of the deserted houses at Auburn until the weather moderates, and the crippled men can be removed.

Considerable interest is manifested throughout the upper country in regard to opening the Mullan Road. The Idaho Legislature has memorialized Congress for an appropriation to be used for that purpose. It is also stated that Capt. John Mullan is now in Washington trying to stir up the War Department to take some action in the matter.

Among the late arrivals in this city was a gentleman who came from Montana with a party that attempted to come by the Cour d'Alene Mission. The snow was so deep in the mountains that the party had to turn back and come around by Pen d'Oreille Lake.

The Idaho Legislature has memorialized the President, asking the removal of Judges McBride and Kelly, and endorsing Judge "Alec" Smith. Judge Kelly has been assigned to the Northern Judicial District of Idaho, and "Alec" is to be brought down to the Southern District. While it must be conceded that there has been a plain neglect of duty by the Idaho judiciary, it is clear that the distribution of judges is made from other motives than those that look to the public good.

Four hundred and three tons of rock from the Morning Star Lode, Owyhee, have been crushed, and the aggregate yield is \$239,868 41, or \$298 71 1/2 cents a ton. This return is quite unparalleled outside of Idaho mines. CHARLES BARNES AUSTIN, the express messenger from Boise City to South Boise, has arrived in safety at the latter place, after being reported lost in the snow on Camas Prairie.

The number of franchises granted at the present session of the Idaho Legislature, is very great. Mas. Getzler, and a company of comedians are playing with great success in the Boise mines, and at Boise City.

In order to abolish polygamy in Utah, Senator Douglas thought that it ought to be attached to other States and territories, and said that he "would drive a stake in the middle of the Mormon Temple to mark the place where four separate jurisdictions cornered."

Many Gilmores, daughter of the sheriff of Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, taking advantage of the absence of her parents, released two men, who had been confined in the jail on a charge of stealing oxen, and eloped with them.
