FEMALE Doctor.-Here is a woman who did keep a secret! She kept it all her life, and was only betrayed by death itself. It is, indeed a strange story, but it is no doubt true, as it comes (rom a reliable English paper: "An incident is just now being discussed in military circles so extraordinary that were not its truth capable of being vouched for by official authority, the narration would certainly be deemed absolutely incredible. Our officers quartered at the Cape, between filteen and twenty years ago, may remember a certain Dr. Barry, attached to the medical staff there, and enjoying a reputation for considerable skill in his profession, especially for firmness, decision, and rapidity in different operations. This gentleman had entered the army in 1813, had passed, of course, through the grades of assistant surgeon and surgeon in various regiments, and had served as such in various quarters of the globe. His professional acquirements had procured for him his promotion to the stuff at the Cape. 
