Washing on, Jan. 6.—John Minor Botts has come out in a card denying that he has sought to prevent the admission of the Virginia members. H says be bas maintained that every representative constitutionally elected who iz prepared to comply with the requisitions of the Constitution and laws is as fully entitled to take his -ett as those now occupying seats. To have taken any other ground would have been to admit that the States lately in rebeltion had been out of the Union, and secession consequently lawful and constitutional, a position that nobody will suspect him of occu-

It is stated that Horace Greeley had an in terview with the President. The latter ex-pressed to Greeley his desire to avoid any repture with the Union party.

No less than fourteen names are on the Speaker's list for elaborate speeches on reconstruction. Members of the Cabinet emany orders stopping appointments upon the recomm nation of members of Congress.

During the week ending to day, \$2,700,000 in national currency were issued. The total circulation now is \$240,000,000.

Washington, Jan. 7—The reconstruction committee met yesterday in the room of the Senate Pacific Railroad Committee. All the members were present excepting Hail, Bingham and Gridon. President Juarez entered upon his new term without opposition, except that one General made a protest against the ex-tension of the term, and went over to the French side. Gen. Ridulles has been appointed General-in-chief of the Central Army, in place of Ortega, who was assassinated by order of Maximilian. Gens. M. jia, Epplun, Ewell, Nicholas, Rigelles, D. ego, Alurez and Jose Caravajul have been promoted to be Major Generals, for patriotism and meritorious services. An extensive fraud upon the Internal Revenue Department by the issue of large quantities of counterfeit sigar box stamps has just been brought to light by the authorities of this city. Persons named John Fuch, Charles Mitcherling and a printer named Blomka have been arrested. The latter admits that he printed about 2,500 stamps and destroyed the plate. Blomka and Micherling have been committed to the county jail by U. S. Commissioner Osborn, and Fuch has been admitted to bill. It is supposed that no less than twenty plates have been made and millious of tempes printed and that the found will stamps printed, and that the fraud wil, amount to \$100,000. The counterfeit stamp is about a reighth of an inch wider than the genuine, and the paper on which it is printed is half an inch longer.

A meeting of the adherents of the Morroe doctrine was held in Cooper Institute last night. Letters were read from a number of distinguished men, and addresses were made by William Cullen Bryant and others.
