

THE AUSTRALIAN MINES.—During the year 1862 there were employed in the Australian gold fields an average number of 97,942 miners, the produce of whose labor was 1,702,460 ounces, equal to \$30,000,000. This makes the average weekly earnings of each miner within a fraction of \$5. In 1863 the average number of miners employed was 92,292, who produced 1,578,069 ounces, equal to \$29,405,422. During the year 1864 the average number of miners employed was 83,394, who obtained as the result of their labors, 1,557,807 ounces of gold. During the first half of 1865, the number of men engaged was 85,022. They produced 756,435 ounces of gold.—These results, it will be seen, are quite uniform for the past three or four years. The first six months of the present year, more especially the latter half of that period, was a trying time for the miners. The long continued drought exercised a most prejudicial influence. At many of the newly opened fields, especially, numbers of men were idle from the want of water, the working of machines was suspended, and the yield of gold was very sensibly effected. Under these circumstances a very serious deficiency was expected in the amount of gold produced during the period referred to. That this has not been the case speaks well for the wealth and permanency of the auriferous resources of Australia.

AN important invention has been made in San Francisco, intended to facilitate the lowering of boats in case of shipwreck, or in stormy weather. The boat is dropped instantaneously from the davits, and launched with an impetus that at once clears it from the side of the vessel. It is a fair estimate that one half of the lives lost by the wrecking of ocean steamers, is caused by the swamping of the boats as they are lowered. This invention is an incalculable benefit in such cases.
