A LIBERAL GRANT.—The Big Tree Grove, of Mariposa, and Yosemite Valley have been granted to California by the United States, subject to certain conditions. The State of Oregon ought to put in a claim for the cession of the mountain-peaks of the Cascades Range—particularly Mount Hood. The State should guarantee the preservation of these remarkable monuments of nature against the Vandals of persons who might be disposed to attempt their destruction.—

Some measures might also be taken to prevent the misrepresentation of the height of Mount Hood by literary tourists and peregrinating Congressmen. All artists who paint our mountain scenery should not be allowed to include the great peaks without paying for the privilege. A good

thing, in the financial way, would be the collection of a tax on all persons coming up the Columbia River, for a sight at Mount Hood—children, Africans and Chinamen, half price—ladies, free. This tax should in no case be remitted on the plea that the traveler "did not see it." In order to make the most of such a grant, it ought to be made actionable for any person to speak disrespectfully of Mount Hood, or to institute comparisons between that peak and Shasta Butte, having the purpose to exalt the latter. But first, we should procure the fee-simple to these mountains. To that end we ask, in fact demand, that our Senators and Congressman do at once proceed to procure from our revered Uncle Sam the title to Mounts Hood, Jefferson, the Three Sisters, and all other peaks over 8,000 feet in height in the Cascades Range. We certainly have as good a right to these mountains as California has to Yosemite Valley, and if that State boasts the ownership of the deepest valley on the Pacific Coast, we certainly ought to own the highest mountain. We have no objection to a stipulation that if Oregon should ever cut loose from the Union, she is to leave Mount Hood and the other peaks behind her.

Upon this point the State ought to give such guarantees as will be satisfactory. The pride of ownership and possession will be sufficient to prevent the State from allowing the crests of these mountains to be truncated for the purpose of erecting drinking-houses, or laying out skittle-grounds above the clouds.

THE RUSSO-AMERICAN TELEGRAPH EXPEDITION.—The ships of the Russo-American Telegraph Expedition have returned to San Francisco. The entire fleet consists of five vessels, viz.: The steamer *Geo. S. Wright*, the barques *Golden Gate*, *Clara Bell*, *Palmetto*, and the schooner *Milton Badger*. The *Golden Gate* is the flag-ship of the fleet; she is commanded by Capt. C. M. Scammon, of the U. S. Revenue Service, and by especial authority of the Secretary of the Treasury, is permitted to bear the revenue flag while engaged in this service. The expedition, during the summer, has accomplished all that could have been desired in furthering the great enterprise in which it is engaged; great energy has been displayed, much progress made, and a large amount of information gathered, of especial value to the company, and of no little importance to the cause of science. Col. Bulkley is the chief of the expedition.
