The labor and economy which would sim-ply enable an Ohio farmer to live comfortably, would, in many portions of Tennessee, owing to our genial climate and generous soil, enable him in a short time to become independent. There are but few portions of the State at this time where emigrants would have any cause for serious apprehension on account of the disturbances of the country.
