ANOTHER WARNING .- The late heavy fall of snow is a timely warning to stock raisers to make preparations against a recurrence of the like and other year. Allowing that two feet of snow is something uncommon, it is still a proof that, without a reasonable provision of stock feed, the increase of years may be lost in two weeks. The climate in the Columbia Basin is certainly favorable to the economical production of live stock, but it cannot be said that the business is safe with out due preparation for the contingency of a bad winter. Two or more of these unfavorable seasons are likely to come in succession, and then the difficulties of providing for stock will be considerably increased. In the highly favored localities to the north of us there is a great area of grass; hands, where hay may be secured in any desirable quantity, and, by the use of the machine mowers, the cost will he but trifling. It is a liberal calculation that half a ton of hay to each head of horses or neat-stock will, upon an average, secure them from any possibility of starvation, and this proportion should annually be cut and cured.

THE RECENT RISE IN THE DES CHUTES.-Last week the Des Chutes River rose four or six feet in a few hours, while the ground was covered with about two feet of snow, on an average, and the air was frosty and piercing. This circumstance has set the more scientific and inquiring pore tion of the population to theorizing upon the cause of this, before, unheard of phenomenon. One theory was that there had been a heavy fall of rain on the head of the river; but this was discarded upon the ground that when it is freezing in the valleys it cannot be reasonably expected to rain on the mountains. The most original and startling idea is that Mount Hood has finally poured streams of lava down its sides into the Des Chutes, thus melting the snow in quantities sufficient to raise the river as aforesaid. This theory is rather too original to be correct.

SAM. Bownes, of the Springfield Republican, expresses the fear that Oregon will go Democratic next election, on account of the influx of people from the Copperhead sections of the west. In that case, our surmise that Oregon might yet become the Missouri of the Pacific will be fulfilled.

A Fren the "Colfax party" got back to California, the tone of the letters of some members of it to the eastern press changed very materially. Mr. Bowles particularly expressed very untavorable opinions in regard to the mines in Idaho, which he had never visited, and consequently knew nothing about.
