says the steamer Sallie, captured by outlaws was rescued by a detachment of the 21st Missour. After landing about 70 b les of government cotton, the outlaws left. The officers of the boat, who were in durance vile during its poss-ssion by the guerrillas, say they expressed a determination to prevent Government cotton coming down the Alabama river.

A fire occurred at Talladega, Alabama, involving a loss of \$70,000.

Four car loads of co ton were burned in Texas, on the Central Railroad, en route for Loss \$3 0,000.

He writes to a friend as follows: The commanding officers of the fron-tier and the political leaders have all ex-pressed their approval of the extension of my term, and I have reason to believe that the same will happen in other States of the Republic.


