NEWS OF THE INTERIOR IN DETAIL.

The Idaho Legislature has passed a memorial to Congress, asking Congress to create a territory out of North Idaho, Western Montana and Eastern Washington. The memorial also asks for a slice of the northern district of Utah to be attached to Idaho. This is for the purpose of bringing the proposed route of the branch of the Central Pacific Railroad to the Columbia River entirely inside of Idaho. Another memorial has passed asking for the establishment of a mail route from Idaho City to South Boise.

A new road from Boise City to Middle Boise quartz district has been surveyed. It runs up that stream and is a cut-off of forty miles on the old road by Rocky Bar.

Considerable quantities of beaver, otter, marten and fox skins are offered for sale in Boise. They are mostly taken on the Weiser and Payette rivers.

Gov. Lyon's policy has been approved by the Legislature. What his policy is, is not yet stated, but it seems to be to soft-soap the miners, the democracy, the diamond-mines, the gold mines, the silver mines, and everything else that will bear having soft soap put on to it. He feeds all with whom he has anything to do with soft solder—soft solder in public, soft solder in private, morning, noon and evening. This, then, is what the Idaho democracy approves in a joint resolution. To make the affair still more ridiculous, the same body endorses the policy of "the President and Gov. Lyon" in the same resolution.

Flour was selling at \$30 a hundred at Idaho City, on the 8th of January.

The snow is about four feet deep on an average in the Boise Basin.

The Chinese miners tax is fixed at \$5 a month in Idaho Territory.

The weather has been very severe since the holidays at Walla Walla.

From the Des Chutes to the Umatilla, along close to the Blue Mountains, there is but little snow; the Chinook wind of last week pretty well cleared it off. Stock is, in consequence, doing well everywhere to the east of this place.

The loss of stock about the mouth of the Owyhee has been very severe from the cold of the past month.

THE BRIDGES ON THE DES CHUTES.
We are very glad to be able to state that Nix & Co.'s bridge across the Des Chutes has not been carried away by the freshet. The two bridges below are gone, as before stated. Mays' bridge, at the upper crossing, of the Des Chutes is safe.

On the John Day, after the bridges were carried away, the ferry boat on the Walla Walla road got adrift, and there is now no means of crossing vehicles; but a large number of passengers from above have succeeded in reaching this place, after crossing John Day in a small boat.

A YOUNG man committed suicide in San Francisco, some weeks ago, his last act being to write a note to 'Cora,' a young girl who refused to marry him. This note is sufficient to indicate the mental calibre of the suicide.


