

THE ENTERTAINMENT AT CHAPIN'S HALL.—The series of tableaux, interspersed with vocal and instrumental music attracted about two hundred and fifty persons to Chapin's Hall last night, and we only echo the general sentiment in calling it a success.

The singing was particularly excellent. The duett, Mary of Argyle, Mrs. Buchanan and Mr. Schott, was greatly applauded. Departed Days, a trio, was elegantly sung by Mrs. Crossen and Messrs. Stocking and Pattee.

Mr. Boyle's accordeon solo was certainly enough to overcome the prejudices of John Phoenix towards that much derided instrument. It was startling in its novelty, and shows what can be done with a musical instrument when touched by the hands of genius.
