
SOMETHING ABOUT AN UNKNOWN NEGRO .-Near the head of that branch o' the Cœur d'Alene River which the Mullau Roadasce ds i order to attain to the summit of the Bit er Root Range, there is a little s rip of prairie vome distance off of the road in the mid tof the dense fores of Spanish cedar and sprace, which extends along the upper section of the river. It is a singularly lonely place, and for some (wenty miles either way from it, there Is no p ace where enough grass can be found to feed a dozen horses. It was into this p'ace, on the evening of the 2d of July, 1865 that a party of disappointed Cour d'Alene prospector tu wed off of the man ro d to camp. Passing along a trail, where the thense un erbrush hung acress it, the foremost rider of the party was start d, on e nerging into be prairie-ground, to see an old negro man lying dead on the ground. An examination showed that he had been w tot though the heart, the bullet going under the shoul e -blade and coming out of his breast. The party remained all night at the prairie, and humanely busied the man. At that time everybody was traveling towar s Black oot, and if the murderer or marderers had gone on in that direction, it would be difficult to overtake them, and once in the mines, to trace them would cost more a auble than anybody was likely to take for the sake o' au old segro. The n xt day after the negro was buried, still another party of prosp ctors turned off to the little p sirie to camp, and finding the grave, supposes that it might be a cache contai ing liquors, as in that vicinity there had been several hundred gallon of whiskey cached some year be ore by M llan's sutler, of which a por ion was never recovered. Nothing would seem more reasonable than that some of these liquors had een found and buried, and the stane of a grave given to the coche to keep travelers. from digging it up. Such things are often done in the mountains. Not to be "played" in this way, our of the boys started to dig up the contents of the hote, and in a moment expused the face of the poor old negro He was a second time examined; the wo ds were rearched, and a saddle was found with b ood on it; an old pair of saddle- ags was found a another place with a spelling-book in it, and several other articles of no particula interest. The negro wasburied again, and t e articles taken to be used in identifying him. At the Bitter Root Ferry, fifty miles that, information was obtained that the old negro and an Indian boy were traveling tuge her from Heligase Ronde towards Walls Waita. The negro had some money and a vide. The Indian had neither arms nor money The negro was a contraband who had con fi cated himself and stole himself all the way from Kentucky to Monte fit. He was old, harmless and stopid; yet be had bought a selling book and was in pursuit of knowledge under difficulties. The negro's burse and rifle had been traded off by an fadir a boy at the Cour d'Alene Mission, and and already got back to the Bitter Root River in the hands of a man who was bound for Blackfoot. very reasonable to suppose that in that little prairie, enclosed by the trees which reared their cone shaped tops sky word, with witness but the birds and the Att-seeing Eye of God, this Indian boy trencheronsly slew the unsuspicious of a black man, and app o printed his property. "Old Jike," for each was the begre's name, died a stranger in a strange iano, and all that he ever told of his parentage, nativity and history was "fee from Ole K-niucky, Massa," The balance is blank; save that he fled from slavery, was stupid, bought a spelling book and was Tue place where he was slatu is called "Nigger Prairie" now.
