**THE WALLA WALLA ROAD**—The condition of the road hence to Walla Walla, is deplorable. There is no bridge on the direct line of travel from the Des Chutes to the Walla Walla River; the road, where it runs in ravines, is gullied out so as to render the passage of vehicles impossible; the creek and river bottoms are everywhere miry; the hills have, save in a few places, no practicable grades, and there is but limited provision made for the subsistence of men and horses on the road. The interests of the interior require that some measures be taken to restore this once great thoroughfare to a passable condition. Walla Walla is particularly interested in attracting the land travel to Montana by this road, and unless it is placed in repair other lines of travel will derive the benefit of the usual spring movement of population.

**IT NEVER RAINS BUT IT POURS.**—The accumulated mail matter of six weeks was brought from the Cascades yesterday morning by the steamer *Idaho*. There were two tons of letters and papers, and the letters could not be distributed until one o'clock, p. m. The distribution of the paper mail was not finished until late at night. Whether we have received all or only a part of the deferred mails is not yet determined. Among the papers were some which left San Francisco on the 21st of September, 1865, which speaks volumes for the speed, certainty and consequent usefulness of the mail line from Sacramento to Portland. It also indicates a vigor in the management of the line which should entitle the contractors to extra compensation.
