**MAIL TO CANYON CITY**—By private advices from Washington we learn that Col. Nesmith has succeeded in inducing the Second Assistant Postmaster General to advertise for mail service between the Dalles and Canyon City. Offers have also gone forward to temporarily render the service for the minimum paid per mile on any mail route in Oregon. We congratulate our Canyon City friends on the probability of having mail communication at an early day.

The steamer *Pacific* on her last downward trip only took \$88,000 from Portland, which indicates that when communication is broken off with the Columbia interior, the shipments of treasure are merely nominal. This alone should interest the people below the Cascades in the construction of a road from The Emporium and Vancouver through the Columbia River gorge.

We observe with pleasure that one San Francisco paper appears disposed to fairly represent the mining interests of the Columbia Basin. We refer to the *Mining and Scientific Press*; a weekly paper made up of valuable original and selected articles relating to the sciences in general, and particularly to those connected with the mining interests.

JOHN BELL, of Tennessee, says that his position has been misunderstood in his relation to the southern rebellion. He proposes to write a justification of his course, which will necessarily prove a lengthy and laborious task.

The placable and docile disposition of the negroes at the South speaks silently but forcibly in favor of that race. It may also be taken as a proof that the stories of outrageous oppression by the whites are the infrequent exceptions and not the rule.

JOHN COLLINS, the vocalist, advertised to sing in London Lover's song of the Widow McChree, "with additional verses." Lover, who is yet living, protested energetically against any "changes, additions or interpolations" in or to the song.

SEVERAL of the ministers of Don Pedro, emperor of Brazil, are either black or partially bleached. This alarming fact has cast a cloud over the prospects of emigrants from the south to that country.

Mr. Louis McLane has proposed to the Government to carry the Overland Mail from the Missouri River to Salt Lake in eight days, instead of the thirteen or fourteen now occupied by Holladay in performing the same.

At the commencement of the war, Wigfall called the government "the onehorse power at Washington." Wigfall's opinion on the power of the government would be particularly valuable about this time.
