**CAST-IRON NAILS.**—Cast-iron nails are now extensively used, and are found to rust much less rapidly under the influence of the atmosphere than ordinary nails, or even those of copper. They are used especially in making roofs for manufactories which produce gases that corrode common wrought-nails. The nails, after being cast from very hot metal in sand moulds, are rendered malleable by being exposed to a red heat for seventy-two hours, in reverberatory retorts, containing pulverized oxide of iron and sawdust, and then allowed to cool slowly.

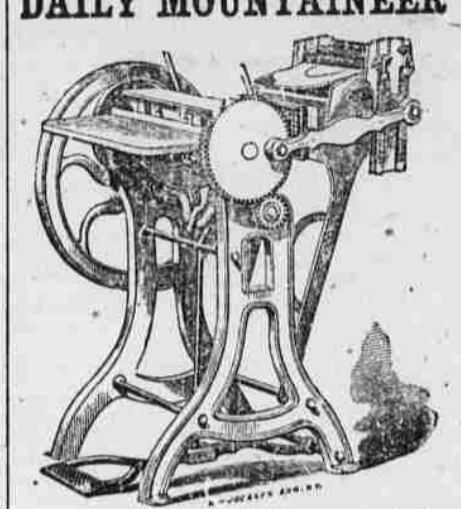
