THE MONTANA TRADE.

We have adviced to the 12th of January, 1866, from Virginia City, at which time the stock of flour was considered sufficient for the winter demand. Notwithstanding this, the prices had considerably advanced, and at Diamond City \$40 a hundred was readily obtainable; Helena, Deer Lodge and Blackfoot, prices are somewhat in advance of the Virginia City quotation given below.

Tobacco has declined at Virginia, but in the northern section of the Territory goods brands are selling at from \$6 to \$8 a pound.

Goods continued to arrive at Virginia until New Year's Day—mostly from Fort Union, but the quantities were limited.

There is a great scarcity of mining tools at Blackfoot City and Helena, and high prices are ruling; particularly for pick-handles and superior picks from the Pacific side.
