A MODEL STATE.—The State of Iowa which sent some seventy thousand troops into the field—exceeding its quota by nearly six thousand—instead of being overrun and borne down with obligations, has a State debt of a little over three hundred thousand dollars, which she can pay off at any time. None of her counties are in debt in consequence of the war. The reason for this extraordinary exhibit is to be found in the fact that her people went out and fought instead of hiring others to do so. What a contrast this is to most of the States that are now staggering under millions of debt, incurred for the purpose of filling their quotas.

The Virginia City *Enterprise* says: The new telegraph line of the United States and Pacific Telegraph Company is being rapidly and most energetically pushed on ward towards completion. It is already finished from San Francisco to Carson, and within one week from now it is thought the line will be completed to this city. In a few days it will be completed between here and Austin, there being only a couple of miles or so of it remaining to be constructed, which is in Six Mile Canyon. Carpenters are now at work preparing an office for the new telegraph company, in the south corner of Wells, Fargo & Co.'s office. When completed, they will commence operations immediately.

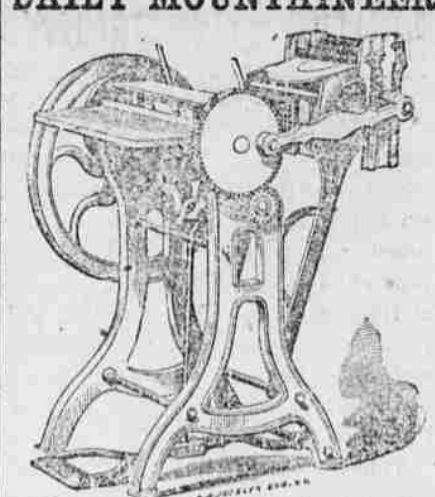
