THE MAIL TO CANYON CITY AND BEYOND.—The circumstances attending the advertisement of the mail route from the Dalles to Boise City, and the invitation for bids for service on the same, are peculiar, and give but a short time for action on the part of those desiring to obtain contracts.—Mr. Brooks, on this account, is doing the best he can by receiving bids for service here and telegraphing them to the Department. It is essential that parties should make the lowest offers which will leave a margin for profit, as anything that looks exorbitant will militate against the establishment of more than a weekly mail, even if it does not altogether discourage the Postmaster General in letting any contract. Bids for daily, tri-weekly, semi-weekly and weekly service to Boise City should also be made, as offers of that kind serve to instruct the Department as to the cost of the route, even when there is no intention to put on service. In this case, however, a reasonable bid for tri-weekly service will probably lead to the establishment of a through mail line. Bids should follow the official forms.

At Yreka, says the *Journal*, a woman obtained a divorce at noon and was married at two o'clock. A few years ago it was the fashion in Walla Walla for married women to take a second husband before being divorced from the first. They could not afford to wait the "law's delay," nor to endure a condition of "singularity" for any length of time, however short.

A NEW dredge, for deepening the channel of the Mississippi at its mouth, has been completed. It is in the form of a huge harrow, with immense teeth, and will be dragged over the compact sand and mud which form the bar.—This will stir it up, and the action of the waters—the currents—will disseminate the particles over an increased surface, and thus deepen the channel.

THE TROOK & JENNINGS LODGE.—A shaft on the Trook & Jennings Lode, at Owyhee, is down ninety feet, and gives very encouraging prospects.—The rock is forming with great regularity, and is richer than ever. The ground is mostly held at \$250 a foot.
