

The Washington Chronicle says: "The national credit is in jeopardy. 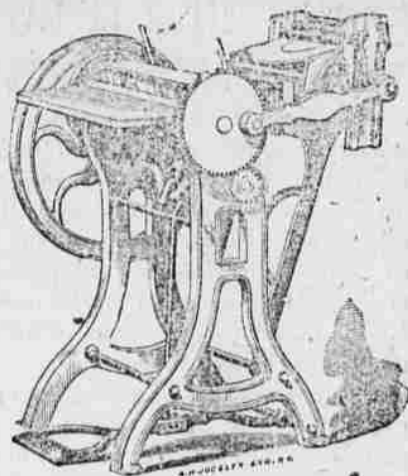
