Washington, Feb. 8 -A number of Democratic members called on the President to day to congratulate him upon his speech to the colored delegation yesterday.

Washington, Feb. 12 .- The ceremonies to day, in commemoration of the services of Abraham Lincoln were in the highest degree impressive. The Capitol was closed this morning to all except Senators, Representatives, offi cials, guests of the President, and citizens holding invitation tickets .-President Johnson was seated in front of the speaker's desk; the Chief Justice and his Associates sat next on his right; diplomatic corps next on the right; and the Cabinet on the President's left; distinguished officers of the army and navy sat next on the left; Representatives in Congress occopying seats on either side of the main aisles; in the rear were seats for Senators; the diplomatic gallery was occupied exclusively by families of members of the diplomatic corps, and the other galleries were crowded with ladies and gentlemen holding tickets; the Marine Band was stationed in the upper vestibule, and discoursed appropriate music, ceasing when exercises commenced. All being in readiness at half-past twelve, Lafayette Foster, President of the Senate, called the two Houses to order. A prayer was offered by Rev. Dr. Boynton, chaplain of the House. The presiding offi-ser then introduced Mr. Bancroft, of New York, who delivered the oration at the clerk's table, occupying two hours. It was heard with marked attention. At the conclusion a benediction was pronounced by Rev. R. Gray, chaplain of the Senate.

Petitions have been received here for presentation to the President, asking for the pardon of John C. Breck inridge, signed by upwards of seventy members of the Kentucky Legislature.


