THE SOUTH IS SAFE .- Looking at the political newspapers dispassionately, we can extract a good deal of wholesome philosophy from them. Thus the extreme Union papers charge the extreme democratic papers with being in sympathy with the late rebels, which the latter most vehemently deny, and declare that their only ob ject is to secure to the south their "rights." Then, not to be outdone in the accusatory vein, they turn upon the Union journals, and assert that they are bitterly bostile to the south and strive to maintain bad feelings betwen the sections, to which the Union papers respond in the most indignant manner, and contend that their only object is to secure a solid peace and perpetual reconciliation. Between these representiive influences it seems to be maifest that the southern people will get all they have a right to expect, and a little more.— Washington Chronicle.

MORE TERRITORY WANTED .- In his message to the Legislature of Arizona. Governor McCormick says: For the accommodation of the southern portion of the Territory, the acquisition of the port of Libertad, upon the Gulf of California, is a matter of the first importance, and whatever the controlling power in Mexico, it should be negotiated for at the earliest practicable moment. Its accession with that portion of the State of Sonora which lies between it and our present line, give new life to the region below the Gila River, and be largely beneficial to the whole Territory.

NITRO.GLYCERENE.-The agents of this new article have issued a pamphlet containing a history of its introduction, with cuts, explanatory of the manner of using it for blasting purpose. It is claimed to be more safe than powder (no explosion being produced by a spark) and possesses ten times its force. Many other advantages are claimed, which, if sustained, must cause it speedily to supercede the use of powder in mining.


