THE JUDGE ON STYLE.—In his letters to the *Bulletin*, The Judge good-humoredly, and with that air of superiority in the Judge of the U. S. District Court who condescends to write for filthy lucre, speaks of the style of our daily cotemporary at The Emporium, ironically observing the use of "recondite words and allusions" by that journal. In the first place, we may state that this is the business of the journal in question and none of ours, but when The Judge searches a dictionary through to find such a word as "sesquipedalian" and then spells it "sesquipidalian" (an error carried into print by the proof reader, and which we are open to wager was written in that way,) the perpetrator lays himself open to the charge of "piling on the style" in the use of "recondite words." Moreover, when The Judge couples the word "sesquipedalian" with the abominable doctrines which he has learned out of Blackwood's Magazine, it becomes our business; and, first, we protest against his idea that we should become a homogeneous people. In time we hope this may be true as to whites, but we do not wish the homogeneity of the Americans to include the colored race, which is the logical consequence of absolute homogeneity under the circumstances in which we are placed on this continent. In the next place, we apprehend that The Judge's doctrine of the abolition of the State governments does not meet the approbation of one American in ten; we believe, in common with a vast majority, that it never can and never ought to come to pass. In the next place, if it were possible that such a state of affairs should ever exist, we believe that The Judge would have laws made to arrest and imprison any person who called in question the absolute perfection of the style, sentiments and opinions of his letters to the *Bulletin*. It is very fortunate that The Judge has thus exposed his monarchical ideas, as he has been a chronic candidate for the United States Senate ever since since he was eligible to vote at any election. With the exposure of his real sentiments, we have no fear that he will ever succeed in mustering even a baker's dozen to assist in his election to the Senate.
