Washington, Murch 2 .- In the Senate, Mr. Nesmi 6 introduced a petition from the offi-

eers of the Pacific squadron, asking an in-crease of pay. Referred to naval committee. The bill granting lands in aid of the construction of a road from Springfield, Mo., to the Pacific passed. It endows the Atlantic and Pacific Railroad Company with the func-tions of a body corporate and pulstic. It nuthorizes It to construct a railroad and tele-graph line from Springfield, Mo., via Canadian river, at a point between 95° and 98° west, crossing the Rio Pecos near Antonchico, to the town of Albuquerque, on the Del Norte, thence via Agua Frio or other suitable place, to the headwaters of the Colorado and Chiquito, thence along the 35th parallel of lati-tude to the Colorado river, and thence by the most practicable and eligible route to the Pacific Branch, from its junction with the Cana-dian river and boundary line of Arkansas, near Van Buren. The authorized capital stock of the company consists of one million of shares of one bundred dollars each. The bill grants the right of way through the pub-tic lands, with the right to take stone, tim-ber and earth from adjacent lands for its con-struction. Two hundred feet on each side of the road is oranted through the public do-main including the grounds measurer for anain, including the grounds necessary for stations and other buildings. An extinction of Indian titles as rapidly as

possible, shall be effected, as to all lands falling under such grant, but not without the consent of the President. Coal and iron lands will be regarded as mineral. No money shull be taken from the Government Pacific Railroad. It requires the commencement of its construction within two years, and the completion of not less than fifty miles each completion of not less than alty miles each year, and the construction and equipment of the whole line by the 5th of July, 1868. It authorizes the Southern Pacific Railroad of California to connect with the Atlantic and Pacific Railroad near the boundary of California, and authorizes the Northern Central Ruilroad of Nevada to construct a branch road to connect with the Atlantic and Pacific.

The bill providing for the non-admission to their seats of the Senators and Representatives from the Southern States until Congross shall declare such States entitled to representation, was taken up. Mr. Irwin spoke against the prepositiou. The Senate then adjourned.
