Epitome of Telegraphic News.

San Francisco, March 8.—The annual election for the officers of the Mechanic's Institute yesterday ended in a drawn ballot, the regular and opposition tickets each electing half of their candidates.

About 7 o'clock this morning a man was seen hanging about Wells, Fargo & Co.'s, waiting for the establishment to open. His movements were so singular as to attract the attention of passers by, and he was watched with interest by the people in the vicinity.

The charter election in Oakland took place yesterday, and resulted in the success of the Union ticket, with the exception of one Councilman. The contest was very spirited, no less than twelve candidates being in the field for City Marshal.

Wm. A. Barnes, Wm. Evans, and W. L. Farren, the soldiers who attacked a man and stripped him of his clothing, had an examination in the Police Court yesterday, and were held to answer before the County Court on charge of highway robbery, with bail fixed at \$1,000 in each case.

In the absence of gold quotations later than last Saturday, 133 1/2, there is not much activity in legal tenders. They are firm, however, at 74 1/2 @ 74 3/4.

LOOKING UP.—Trade in the Dalles is beginning to stir, and we may safely say that the spring is about to fairly open on us. For the past few days Bloch, Miller & Co. have been busy in shipping goods to Wallula for the Montana trade, while French & Gilman have been not only supplying their Montana customers, but have also loaded some two or three trains for Canyon City.

THERE are seven daily newspapers issued in Nashville—six English and one German. When the war began there were four, all English. A daily paper in the German language is a new feature in the history of Nashville. The German population of that city is rapidly increasing, and its increase is considered an augury of good. Industry generally goes with the German people.

THE Saxons have been "lionizing" General McClellan. He is spending the winter in Dresden. On the 12th of December, Mr. Van Boust gave a party in honor of King John's birthday, to which the General was invited. A few days later he was granted a private audience by the King.

MENKEN is on her way to this country with several Mazappa steeds.

A MERCHANT in San Francisco had a bill of \$32 to collect, and to avoid the expense of buying a two-cent revenue stamp, made out two bills of \$16 each. The debtor refused to acknowledge the account, saying that he owed only one bill of \$32, and when that was presented with a stamp on it, he would pay it. The merchant was compelled to come up to the law and invest two cents for a stamp. He must be a small merchant.

QUITE a number of men are now at the Dalles fitting out for the mines. These men have all come from below, and are unanimous in the expression that they can do better by buying their outfits here than in Portland. Such we find to be the prevailing opinion of both packers and traders from above.

A SOLDIER stole a bottle of whisky in San Francisco lately, and paid for it by being sent to the County Jail for three months. Rather costly.

THE steamer Sierra Nevada left San Francisco for Portland on the 6th inst. She will probably arrive in Portland to-morrow evening.
