Nay, also, the matter of that eye which reads this saying, and is, perhaps, startled at it, a little while ago was allied to the elements of inorganic matter; and the time cannot be very distant ere some have to mourn over those terrible words read over it, of "dust to dust, and ashes to ashes." The very tear of affection was once water and a little rock salt; and after a little time it will be water and rock salt once more.

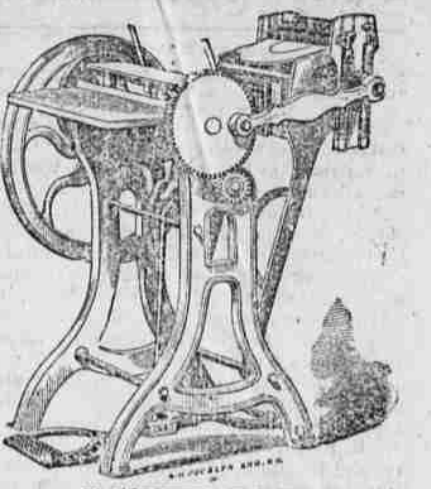
