FREEDMANS BUREAU BILL.—The following is a synopsis of the leading features of the bill for enlarging the powers of the Freedmen's Bureau, recently vetoed by the President:

SEC. 1. Original act to continue in force; President to establish twelve or less districts, with an Assistant Commissioner for each, to be appoint ed, or, in his discretion, detailed from

the army.
SEC. 2. The Commissioners to assign sub districts, with an agent to each. Assistant Commissioners may have six_clerks, agents of sub-districts two; military jurisdiction to extend over

all employees of the Bureau. Sec. 3. The Secretary of War may direct such issues of provisions, clothing, fuel, etc., for refugers and freed. men, as he deems needful.

SEC. 4. The President may reserve for freedmen and refugees 3,000,000 acres of unoccupied lands in Florida, Mississippi and Arkansas, which the Commissioner of the Bureau shall allet in 10 acre parcels; rent thereof to be based on a valuation of the land, and occupants to purchase at assessed value.

Sec. 5. Titles to Sea Islands, etc., under Sherman's orders, confirmed for three years.

Sec. 6. The Commissioner shall purchase lands required for support of dependent freedmen and refugees, and build asylums and schools; Congress to provide appropriations for the same, and the lands not to be sold at less than cost.

SEC. 7. Where right of labor of contract, of inheritance, of property, the equal benefit of laws, security of person, etc, are denied to freedmen, the President shall extend military juris-diction and jurisprudence for their protection.

SEC. 8. Whoever subjects any freedman to slavery or involuntary servi-

tude, except as punishment for crime, or discriminates between white and black in penalties, shall be fined \$1,000, and one year's imprisonment. Officers of the Bureau to have jurisdiction of all such complaints, so long as, and wherever such discriminations on account of coler continues, and wherever State and United States Courts are not in full and peaceful operation.
