Galveston, March 8.—The convention laid on the table a motion to make white inhabitants the basis of representation. A motion to strike out the word "white" was test-26 against 44. A motion to leave it optional with the legislature to fix the basis of repre sentation was lost -26 to 38. An ordinance establishing a quarantine of 20 days for all Texas ports was passed as a preventative

against cholera.
Chicago, March 10.—The Secretary of War transmitted to the Senate, on Wednesday, 7 h inst., information relative to the construction of a telegraph from New Orleans to San Francisco, and from St. Paul to Portland, Oregon. The applicants ask that protection with subsistence and transportation as far as possible be supplied by military commanders at posts on the route, in compensation for which they propose to transmit Government messages free. The Secretary says the applications were referred to Gen. Grant, who recommends protection but not subsistence or transporta-tion. The Secretary further says the War Department does not assume the authority to grant the right or title to construct lines, and contemplates nothing more than to parnish such protection as may be without prejudice to the service, leaving parties to obtain char-

ters from competent authority.

Washington, March 10 -Tue House to-day went into committee of the whole for general debate.

Another instance of the testimony taken before the reconstruction committee will be reported to Congress next week, including the testimony of Gen. Lee, who says he never took an oath to support the Confederacy,

having always purposely avoided it.

The Attorney General, who is making a list of pardons, in answer to an inquiry of the House, will show about 15,000 pardons, mostly under the \$20,000 clause.

Washinton, March 11 .- In the Senate, Mr. Grimes offered the memorial of the lowa Legislature, asking for the speedy trial of Jeff. Davis, which was referred to the Judi-

eisry Committee.

Washington, March 12.—The Joint Committee of cases between the United States and New Grenada will resume their labors to-day, when they will consider the important interest of connection with the Panama Railroad.

The House Judiciary Committee will be ready on Tuesday to again report the civil rights bill. A proviso will be added which will make the bill explicit on the subject of

Secretary Seward officially assures the British Minister that any attempt by Fenians to invade Canada or violate neutrality law will be promptly punished. 
