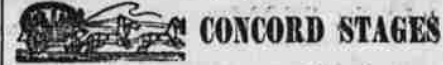
A beautiful girl stepped into a shop to buy a pair of mitts.

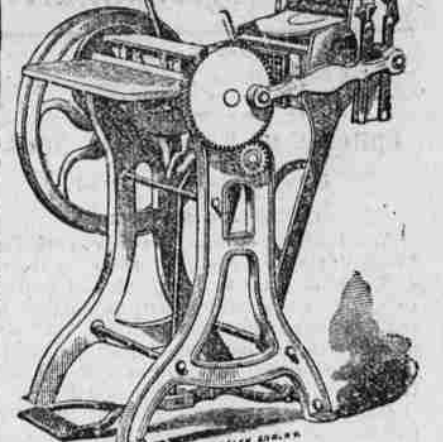
