HOMICIDE AT PORTLAND.—A man named George Badue was shot in front of a house of ill-fame in Portland, on Saturday morning last, by some person unknown. Badue was a fugitive from justice in California.

UMATILLA COUNTY DELEGATES.—The Union County Convention for Umatilla County, selected the following gentlemen as delegates to the Union State Convention: Thomas McCoy, W. H. Barnhart, H. S. Stone, Wardwell, and J. C. Franklin.

NOTABLE DEATH.—Hon. A. M. Poe, formerly editor of the Overland Press, Olympia, W. T., and a genial, whole-souled man, died recently in Napa City, Cal. Deceased had filled several important positions in the neighboring Territory.

THE RUSH TO THE MINES.—The steamer Ononta came up yesterday afternoon with about 150 passengers. The Pacific had arrived at Portland with over 300 passengers, and the Montana was met at the mouth of the Willamette, perfectly crowded. Her passenger list is estimated at 500.

SHOOTING AFFAIR NEAR UMATILLA.—Two men named Jack Montgomery and Strickland, had a difficulty last Saturday, about four miles from Umatilla, in which both drew their pistols, and Montgomery was shot through the abdomen—the ball lodging somewhere in the hip. The wounded man was brought down on the cars yesterday, and is in a critical condition.

CAMP POLK.—A temporary military post near the crossing of the Crooked River and Eugene Roads, has been ordered abandoned. It was garrisoned the past winter by a portion of Capt. Lafollette's Co., A., of the 1st Oregon Infantry, who, as soon as transportation can reach them, will come in to be mustered out of the service.

BEAUTIFUL WORK.—The Masons of the Dalles have added to the furniture of their hall two beautiful pillars of exquisite workmanship. The wood work and carving, by Mr. A. W. Ferguson, and the painting, or rather the bronzing, by Mr. O. S. Savage, both worthy craftsmen, and brethren of Wasco Lodge No. 15. We have never seen any better work of this kind; the imitation of bronze is so perfect that one is tempted to strike the pillar with his knuckles, with the expectation of producing a metallic ring.

THE ROUTE TO BLACKFOOT AND BIG BEND, by way of White Bluffs, is attracting a good deal of attention just now. The committee of gentlemen appointed by the citizens of this place to enquire into the merits of this route are so favorably impressed with its advantages, that they have, after due consideration, determined to thoroughly advertise it, and make its merits as an overland road, known to the public. If their representations are correct, and we believe they are, this is certainly the best route for those who intend going by land from this point, either to Blackfoot or Big Bend.
