Grant Cognty Delegatron.-Tho following gentlemen compose the Union delegation from Grant county to the State Convention: M. A. Berry, F. Adame, H C. Gregory, T. F. Brendt and J. F. Wolfinger. The county convention meets on the lst of May for the nomination of county officers.
Canyon City.-Sheriff Berry, who arrived from Canyon City yebterday informs us that high water in the Canyon had done considerable dam. ago to the miners by filling up their claims; but that they had now got fairly to work, and the prospocts were that they would reap a rich harvest the present sqason. Indian depreda tions still continue on the road be tween tere and Canyon. Only a few daye since, the Indians drove a band of horses they bad stolen, so close to Camp Watson that the sentinel could distinclly recognizo them. In fact the savages aro becoming so bold that they do not seem to pay any attention to the presence of the troops. Every person. who owns a cow or a horse about Canyon City is compolled to guard them; and miners are confined to the limits of the town, in order that they may not loose their bair, thus etfectually rotarding the development of the richest mineral region east of the Cascade mountains. How long is this to last? How long before our military authorities wake up and see the necessity of sending more troops to proteat the lizes and property of these people who are the bone and sinew of the government? This military department was ouce cursed by the presence of an old granny who com manded it for three yeare, and but for whom, there is not the least doubt, those red devils would have been long singe exterminated. Let the citizons of the Dalles and Canjon City follow the example of those of Boise and Ruby citios, and we will vouch for the result.

From Canyon City-Sad Newb. We have received from Mr. Jamen A. Henderson, Agent of Wells, Fargo \& Co., Canyon City, the following note addressed to him, conveying the sad intelligence of the death of Mr. Benj. Powers:
 Mr. Hexdersox-Agent Welle, Fargo of Co., Canyon City:-I bave and news to communi cate. Benjamin Powers is dead-he froze to death last night. We had got within five miles of the Mountain Houie when Ben. gave out. One other of the party tbrew away his blankets. When Ben, and myeelf came up be ( Beo .) conoluded to atop and build a firo, and row, and thee come on. If not, be wocld
stay there all night and come on in the morning Ho bad plenty of matches with him, ao I did not teel unensy about him. The balance of us came on, and when within a mile of the bouse, Jobn Johns, the blackemith, gave out. As I could render bim wo assist. ance, I came on to the house. We made the freta known, and one of the men belonging to the honse went back and brought him in about 10 o'clock, with his feet badly frozen As for Ben., wo felt no uneasiness about him. We leh bim with two paira of blankels and plenty of matches. As be did not eome in that night, we despatched a man early this morning with tood to him. When be found him be was two miles this side of where we lefi him, jast alive. The man found he could do nothing by himself, so he built a fire and came bnck to the house, when all hands wen Mr. Powers will be ron the man who assisted in raising Capt. Boland's company of volunteers, in this city, about eighteen monthe since, and who retused to be commissioned owing to some misunderstanding be tween himself and Gov. Gibbs. A the time of his death be was on his way to attend the Union State Con vention, as one of the delegates from Grant county. Mr. Powers was a gentleman of more than ordinary in telligence and of fine sociul qualities
Yaquina Bay.-The Corvallis Gan zette publishes a long lettar from the Yaquina Bay country, which has re cently been cut off from the coast reservation and thrown open for sottlement. A town site has been laid out at the head of the bay, forty two mile from Corvallis, over which distance a company with a capital of $\$ 20,000$ is making a wagon road. It is claimed for the Bay that there is good and safe entrance there for vessels draw ing not over 18 or 20 feet, and that it is so situated that it must become an important shipping point. The writer says:
Here, then, the problem is solved. This Bay and Harbor is a realitynavigable for large ocean steamers for 25 miles. The harbor is safe, and 1,000 vessels can be anchored in it in perfect safety. Its entrance from the ocean is saporior to any inlot from San Franeifeo to Puget Sound. The route from Corvallis to the bay is perfectly adapted to a railroad; of thia there can be no question. Here, then is a matter of vast National, as well as local importance, one which bas been overlooked beretofore-the bay, har bor and, and whole country on this slope having been included in two ln . dian Reservations. In fact, it has been generally supposed that the coas westerly was an iron bound concern.
In addition to the above there is quite an extensive oyster fishery in the bay, which already gives employmen to some twenty five persons. The oysters are loaded in sehooners and sent to various points on the coast, beeides many are packed for the inte rior trade.
