Washington, March 19.—In the House, Mr Kasson, of Iowa, introduced a bill to amend the Act of July 18th, 1862, to aid the construction of a railroad and telegraph from the Amoor river to the Pacific. Referred

to committee on Pacific Rrilroad. Mr. Bidwell, of Cal., introduced a bill to enable the State of California to reclaim lands within the limits of the State. Referred.

Mr. Dawson, of Penn., offered a resolution reciting that the United States cannot guarantee bonds of the Mexican Republic or any other governa.cut without impairing its own credit, and imposing new burdens on the p ople. The House refused to second the demand for the previous question, and the resolution went over.

Mr. Windom, of Minn., introduced a joint resolution authorizing the Secretary of the Interior to pay certain claims out of the appropriation for expenses for Indian affairs. Re ferred.

Mr. Garfield, of Ohio, offered a resolution, which was voted down, directing the committee on printing, to inquire into the expediency of publishing accounts of exploration across the great basin of Utah to San Francisco, in 1859, by Capt. Simpson, of the Engineer Corps.

Mr. Garfield's motion to reconsider the vote by which the loan bill was lost on Friday, came up. and a motion to lay that motion on the table, was defeated. Ayes 2; noes 79. The bill subsequently passed, by a vote of 81

A concurrent resolution was offered that Congress adjourn on fuesday, blank day of May.

Mr. Washburn, of Illinois, asked if it was in order to fill the blank with the last Thursday in May.

Speaker said only by unanimous consent.

Mr. Morrill, of Vt., remarked that such a resolution was premature, until the appropriation bill passed, and called for the ayes and nocs, which resulted, ayes, 80; nocs 64. So the resolution passed.
Mr. Coffroth, of Penn, offered a

resolution, which was adopted, in structing the military committee to report at an early day, a bill for equal. izing bounties for all soldiers and sailors during the late war.

Washington, March 18-In the Senate Wilson reported House bill appointing twelve trustees for the Soldiers' and Sailors' Home, to obviate the difficulty of getting a quorum of the one hundred corporators together, and it was passed. The bill now goes to the President.

Fessenden, of Maine, made explanation about the published letters of Wm A. Graham, saying that Joint Committee could not allow his (Gran ham's) request to cross examine with nosses. They desired the investigation to be full and impartial, and were ready to hear any witnesses who could throw any light on the subject. Graham was of the belief that the testimony had closed because the evidence was stringent; it had not closed except in the case of Tennessee, and if Graham wished to introduce further testimony in the case of North Carolina, he could do so.

Williams, of Oregon, introduced a bill for equalizing bounties on the basis of \$13 per month, the bounties heretofore paid to be deducted and the proceeds in common to be speciafly assigned for this purpose. Re

ferred to the military committee, The House concurrent resolution providing for the adjournment of Congress, was referred to the com-mittee on finance.
